Policing Reports

Chief Superintendent Brian Sutton presented an overview of the key policing activities for the Kildare Divisions at each of the Kildare JPC Meetings, including quarterly crime analysis, crime prevention and community policing measures, road traffic statistics and details of Garda resources. (C.S. Scanlon took over this role for the annual public meeting in December).

The Chief Superintendents and their colleagues responded to questions on the policing reports from members of the committee at each meeting as required.

The issue of Garda resources in County Kildare (Objective 1 of the 2016-2021 JPC Strategic Plan) remains an issue of ongoing concern for the JPC, particularly with the recent expansion of the Garda division to incorporate counties Laois and Offaly. The escalating drug addiction problem came to the forefront in 2019 also and several committee members called for a dedicated drugs policing unit either for the county or for some of the larger towns. There were also requests for dedicated community Gardaí in several locations. Chief Superintendent Scanlon assured the members at the December meeting that he had access to all the resources he required.

CCTV sub-committee

Co. Kildare JPC has a dedicated sub-committee to assist with the rollout of Community CCTV schemes as envisaged by the national scheme announced in 2017. The sub-committee is chaired by Cllr. Aoife Breslin. In addition to nominated JPC members, this committee includes relevant Garda personnel and KCC staff members working in this area.

Kildare County Council has agreed to act as data controller for proposed CCTV feeds. Accordingly, it has prepared a CCTV specification for groups to use to ensure any systems to be installed will be compatible with existing and future traffic management infrastructure. The sub-committee has endorsed this document. Several community groups have expressed interest in installing schemes and are working closely with An Garda Síochána to finalise their applications. Whilst no CCTV schemes have been installed to date, it is hoped that applications will be submitted to the Department of Justice and Equality in 2020.

An Garda Síochána and Municipal Districts councillors

Locally based representatives of An Garda Síochána meet with members of each of the five Municipal Districts on a quarterly basis in advance of the formal JPC meetings and this process continued in 2019. Discussions at this local level can and does help eliminate problems such as anti-social behaviour and damage to public property. Councillors will often have access to information that An Garda Síochána may not have or they may be in contact with residents more frequently. Councillors regard these meetings as a vital part of their engagement with An Garda Síochána.

The members of each Municipal District have stressed the importance of these meetings being held without press or public attendance. The members believe that the formats of these meetings are beneficial as they are an informal exchange of essential information at a local level.

APPENDIX 2

County Kildare Joint Policing Committee Strategic Plan 2016-2021

The plan was adopted in June 2016. The plan's primary goal is to support safer communities by focusing on nine strategic objectives to support enhanced policing and crime prevention.

These objectives are:

- 1. Garda resources.
- Crime prevention assignment of Gardaí to specialist posts such as Community Gardaí, drugs specialists etc.
- 3. Anti-social behaviour and street crime.
- 4. Misuse of drugs, alcohol and related crime.
- 5. Wildlife protection and cruelty to animals.
- To increase public safety of newly designed roads and developments across Kildare – An Garda Síochána and Kildare County Council working in partnership.
- 7. To liaise with older people in the county through the Older Person's Council.
- 8. To strengthen the relationship between An Garda Síochána and the local community.
- To support the local implementation of the National Strategy on Domestic,
 Sexual and Gender-based Violence.

The Joint Policing Committee aims to develop greater consultation and co-operation on policing and crime issues between the Gardaí, the local authority, community representatives and elected public representatives.
