# Goal - Safe Communities - To Facilitate and Support Kildare as a safer place to live and work in

#### 1. Introduction

The Joint Policing Committee (JPC) aims to develop greater consultation, co-operation and synergy on policing and crime issues between An Garda Síochána, Local Authorities and elected local representatives and also with the collaboration of the community and voluntary sectors in this regard

#### Functions of the JPC:

The function of the JPC is set out in section 36(2) of the Garda Síochána Act 2005, which states: "The joint policing committee's function is to serve as a forum for consultations, discussions and recommendations on matters affecting the policing of the local authority's administrative area, and in particular to –

- (a) Keep under review (i) the levels and patterns of crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour in that area (including the patterns and levels of misuse of alcohol and drugs), and (ii) the factors underlying and contributing to the levels of crime disorder and anti-social behaviour in the area.
- (b) Advise the local authority concerned and the Garda Síochána on how they might best perform their functions having regard to the need to do everything feasible to improve the safety and quality of life and to prevent crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour in the area.
- (c) Arrange and host public meetings concerning matters affecting the policing of the local authority's administrative area,
- (d) Establish, in consultation with the local Garda superintendent, as the committee considers necessary within specific neighbourhoods of the area, local policing fora to discuss and make recommendations to the committee concerning matters

that it is to keep under review under paragraph (a) or on which it is to advise under paragraph (b), in so far as these matters affect their neighbourhoods,

- (e) Co-ordinate the activities of local policing fora established under paragraph (d) or otherwise.
- (f) A local authority shall, in performing its functions, have regard to the importance of taking steps to prevent crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour within its area of responsibility.

# County Kildare Joint Policing Committee

County Kildare JPC Committee is made up of 33 members:

- Garda Officers nominated by the Garda Commissioner (2)
- Local Authority Members (15)
- Members of the Oireachtas for the Area (7)
- Local Authority Officials (2)
- Community Representatives (7)

Formal JPC meetings are set at 4 times per year. The public can attend all meetings, but one of the meetings is specifically targeted for active participation by the public.

There is a separate commitment to holding local meetings with Municipal District members, these are informal and help facilitate the familiarisation between elected members and local Gardaí to identify and resolve local engagement outside the formal structure of the County JPC.

The Five Municipal Districts in Kildare are;

- Naas Municipal District
- Athy Municipal District
- Newbridge-Kildare Municipal District
- Maynooth Municipal District
- Celbridge-Leixlip Municipal District

# 2. Background to County Kildare - Statistical Overview - Profile of County Kildare

The JPC received presentations from Garda Authorities and these were combined with statistics from the AIRO (All Ireland Research Observatory, Maynooth University). Baseline data revealed important facts emerging which underpin and inform the Kildare Local Economic & Community Plan (LECP) which is the overriding plan covering the economic and social development of the county over the next 6 years.

# 3. Strategy Development Process

The LECP plan includes 12 high level goals. Goal 8 states that "Safe Communities" is to facilitate and support Kildare as a safer place to live and work in, because no community or business can function properly in a persistently unsafe environment. Kildare County Council, in partnership with the LCDC, local communities, civil society and the business community will plan and work to ensure that people living in Kildare continue to live and work in a safe environment.

Under the current guidelines each Joint Policing Committee must put in place a six year plan linked to the relevant objectives in the Local Economic and Community Plan of the Local Authority – "The Kildare Local Economic and Community Plan 2016 – 2021 (LECP)". The Annual Policing Plan – "An Garda Síochána Policing Plan 2016, Kildare Division" represents the first instalment of the Garda Operational Plan to deliver the 6 Year Plan.

The consultation process for the County Kildare JPC 6 Year Strategy consisted of two workshops; the first took place in October 2015 consisting of the JPC committee members and the second was conducted as part of the annual public meeting in December 2015 when sixty members of the public attended on the night.

These workshops focused on the following areas:

- (a) Crime
- (b) Community & Policing \_
- (c) Activities Traffic Control, Urban CCTV, Text Alert, Neighbourhood Watch, and Protection of Wildlife
- (d) What can the community itself do?
- (e) What can public bodies do? e.g. Local Authorities, Health Service Executive, Schools, Education Training Board and the Courts Service etc.
- (f) What can the Garda Authorities do?

# 4. Strategic Context

An Garda Síochána in its Policing Plan 2016, for the Kildare Division have high level priorities under:

- National Security and Intelligence To protect our national interest, mitigate the threat posed by terrorism and contribute to international security.
- National Policing Deliver a policing service focused on crime prevention, victim orientation and professional investigations.
- Community Safety Improve public safety through enhanced community engagement and high visibility roads policing.
- Cross Organisation Services Deliver a professional policing and security service using resources effectively and efficiently.

Kildare County Council, through its planning, environmental and regulatory functions plays a leading role in ensuring public safety, and accordingly the theme of "Safe Communities" is considered an integral element in the LECP planning framework. The JPC plays a central role in determining the priority policing objectives for the county in conjunction with local communities. This is to ensure that local needs are central to future policing plans. However, the implementation of these plans will largely rest on the ability to redress service provision and increase policing levels.
